

How Highly Do Organizations Value Collaboration?

Are the days of cutthroat competition among employees finally gone? Let's hope so, said Dave Hoff, the chief operating officer and executive vice president for leadership development at E·A·S·I-Consult[®].

Hoff said there is a positive relationship between collaboration and an increase in revenue, as established by the Corporate Executive Board Co. (CEB). In addition, research has shown that the future leaders in our workforce - millennials - prefer collaboration over working alone.

So now is an important time for organizations to take a good look at themselves and ask these questions:

- How much emphasis does your organization place on collaboration?
- How would you measure this in term of importance?
- How do you as a management team signal to employees that you value collaboration other than giving it lip service?
- How well do your systems and processes support collaboration?

Of course, the best time to determine whether a person has the ability to collaborate is during the selection process. Hoff said organizations must ask themselves whether they consider collaboration to be among the top behavior skills they assess during the hiring process. And if they don't assess for collaboration, why not?
